If your child intends to participate but has not yet registered, please do so as soon possible so Mr. Duncan can distribute the practice and game schedules. Thanks so much.



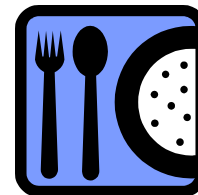
